Speaker Biography:

Dr Colin Berry MB BS FRCA
Consultant Anaesthetist Royal Devon and Exeter NHS Foundation Trust. Exeter, Devon, UK.

I have been a consultant Anaesthetist in Exeter since 1997. Prior to that I worked at University of Virginia (USA) and the Alfred Hospital, Melbourne (Australia). My post-graduate training posts in anaesthesia were in the Royal Navy, Glasgow, Bristol and Plymouth.

Having been Clinical Director for Critical Care and the Transformation team, I have been Medical Director but am now re-engaged in full time clinical practice. I am a member of the Perioperative Medicine Leadership Group at the Royal College of Anaesthetists.

Talk Abstract:

Perioperative Medicine is not new to any of us. It is what we do every day.

The Royal College of Anaesthetists has embarked on an endeavour to collect, develop, support and disseminate all aspects of perioperative medicine from the time of referral, through assessment, treatment, recovery and return to life after surgery. Excellent examples of care are commonplace for patients receiving surgical treatment in the UK and, as anaesthetists, we are at the centre of that care. We are the speciality which is ideally placed to advance and improve the care required by surgical patients.

I will give you an overview of how the perioperative medicine work is progressing at the Royal College of Anaesthetists. This will include discussions pertaining to education, research, workforce and collaboration with other colleges while retaining a focus on improving patient care. I hope this will stimulate discussion both at the meeting and beyond.
